WHAT ARE SUBCONTRACTING AND PARTNERSHIP EXCHANGES (SPX)

Subcontracting and Partnership Exchanges (SPX) are technical information, promotion and match-making centres for industrial subcontracting and partnerships between main-contractors, suppliers and subcontractors, aiming at the optimal utilization (the most complete, rational and productive) of the manufacturing capacities and capabilities of the affiliated industries. SPXs should be organized as non-profit industrial associations run by qualified entrepreneurs. In effect, the Exchanges appear not only as the meeting points and the instruments of regulation between the supply and the demand of industrial subcontracting orders, but also as instruments of assistance to both partners, and particularly the small and medium supplier or subcontracting enterprises.

SPX CLUB

Purposes of the SPX Club

To encourage networking and international cooperation between the Industrial Subcontracting and Partnership Exchanges (SPXs) and with other Industrial Promotion Organizations (IPOs) worldwide, using common technical terminologies, as well as with UNIDO to have access to a series of UNIDO support services. Thus the Club shall become a Global Outsourcing Network for Industrial Business Alliances.

MEMBERSHIP

FULL MEMBERS: The SPXs (or Promotion Centres) which have adopted the UNIDO subcontracting system and have signed the licence agreement for the "OUTSOURCING 2000" software, become automatically full members.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS: The Club is also open to Industrial Promotion Organizations or Institutions (IPOs) and to industrial firms both in industrialized and in developing countries, which have an interest in participating in the network.

MEMBERSHIP FEES: There are neither membership fees nor annual fees, but some services will be provided against payment.
