PREPARATIONS FOR THE NINTH SESSION OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE

Report by the Director-General

Provides general information on the organization of the work of the General Conference, including a draft provisional agenda of its ninth session.

Introduction

1. The General conference of UNIDO is the principal organ of the Organization, consisting of representatives of all Members (Articles 7.1 and 8.1 of the Constitution). The main functions of the Conference are stipulated in Article 8.3 of the Constitution. In particular, the Conference should determine the guiding principles and the policies of the Organization. Unless it decides otherwise, the Conference is to hold a regular session every two years, at the seat of the Organization (Article 8.2). The last regular session (eighth) of the Conference was held in Vienna from 29 November to 3 December 1999.

I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

A. Date and place of the Conference

2. At its eighth session, in decision GC.8/Dec.20, the Conference decided that its ninth session should be held in Vienna from 3 to 7 December 2001. In this connection, as for previous sessions, the Austrian Federal Government has placed at the disposal of UNIDO conference facilities at the Austria Center Vienna (ACV) free of charge for meetings that cannot be accommodated by the conference facilities of the Vienna International Centre.

B. Office space for delegations

3. Office space for delegations and their permanent missions required during the ninth session of the Conference can be rented in the ACV. Delegations wishing to rent such offices are invited to contact, as soon as possible, Ms. Alice Baar, Director of Organization Department, ACV (telephone 260 69, ext. 2323).

C. Budgetary matters

4. The resources available for holding the ninth session of the Conference, as provided for in the programme and budgets of UNIDO, 2000-2001, total \$ 1,142,000. The budget of the Conference is based on the following assumptions:

(a) The session will last five working days providing for 10 plenary meetings, four main committee meetings and five geographical group meetings;

(b) Interpretation for plenary and main committee meetings and documentation will be provided in six languages (Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish);

(c) Summary records, which will be provided for plenary meetings as well as meetings of the main committee, will be issued—to the extent possible—in English during the session and the other five languages will be issued as soon as possible after the session.

For reasons of economy, this document has been printed in a limited number. Delegates are kindly requested to bring their copies of documents to meetings.

D. Agenda

5. In accordance with Article 9.4 (g) of the Constitution, the Board prepares the provisional agenda for each session of the General conference. Rule 13 of the rules of procedure of the Conference provides guidelines for the contents of the provisional agenda of a regular session of the Conference. Furthermore, in accordance with rule 12 of those rules of procedure, the Board shall prepare that provisional agenda on the basis of a list of items submitted to it by the Director-General.

6. Annotations indicating briefly the history of each item, the proposed documentation, the substance of the matter to be discussed and earlier relevant decisions by the conference or other organs of the Organization will be issued following the twenty-fourth session of the Board.

7. The draft provisional agenda for the ninth session of the Conference is contained in the annex to the present document, together with an indication of relevant mandates for the items.

E. Documentation

8. In accordance with rule 23 of the rules of procedure of the Conference, documents required for consideration of items on the provisional agenda shall be distributed by the Director-General in all languages of the Conference to all recipients of the provisional agenda, as far as possible at the same time as the provisional agenda (ninety days before the opening date) and in any event not later than forty-five days before the opening date of a regular session.

II. ORGANIZATION OF THE WORK OF THE CONFERENCE

9. During the ninth session, it is planned to hold an industrial development forum that would enable Member States to express their views on a topic to be announced in due course.

10. In addition, it will be recalled that, at its previous sessions, the Conference established a main committee to which it allocated a number of agenda items. The Board may wish to recommend to the Conference a similar procedure for its ninth session, keeping in mind that the possibility of creating additional committees is constrained by the limited resources available (see para. 4 above). Items 7 to 17 of the draft agenda would thus be referred to the main committee for a more focused debate aimed at the preparation of consensus draft decisions and resolutions for submission to the plenary.

11. The work of the previous sessions was also facilitated by setting up, under the guidance of the President of the Board, informal consultations for the preparation of the Conference. Such an informal group, composed of representatives of permanent missions to UNIDO in Vienna, has met prior to previous Conferences and has prepared a report to the Conference containing recommendations that cover most of the items on the agenda as well as organizational matters.

III. ACTION REQUIRED OF THE BOARD

12 The Board may wish to consider adopting the following decision:

“The Industrial Development Board:

“(a) Takes note of the information provided in document IDB.24/21;

“(b) Adopts the following agenda for the ninth session of the General Conference:

“(c) Agrees to hold a forum within the framework of the General Conference (provisional agenda item 9);

“(d) Recommends to the Conference that items 7 to 17 of the provisional agenda be allocated to a main committee of the Conference;

“(e) Recommends that, in the light of experience gained in the preparation of previous sessions of the Conference, the President of the twenty-fourth session of the Industrial Development Board conduct informal consultations for the preparation of the ninth session of the Conference.”
