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UNIDO ACTIVITIES IN COUNTRIES EMERGING FROM CRISIS SITUATION

Report by the Director-General

Provides a progress report on the developments and steps taken in compliance with resolution GC.10/Res.6.

Introduction

1. This document is issued in accordance with resolution GC.10/Res.6 on UNIDO activities in countries emerging from crisis situations. This resolution took into account the Millennium Development Goals and the important development-related decisions taken by international conferences and stressed the need for international institutions both within and outside the United Nations system, including UNIDO, to enhance within their mandates their cooperative efforts to promote effective and collective support to the implementation of Agenda 21 to achieve sustainable development. Fully aware of the critical situation and vulnerability of people in all countries emerging from crisis situations, including in countries emerging from conflict, and the need for timely support in priority areas to reduce this vulnerability, the resolution noted the ongoing developments of UNIDO's thematic initiative on post-crisis industrial rehabilitation and reconstruction and the round table that took place on this issue during the tenth session of the General Conference of UNIDO in December 2003.

2. In this context, the resolution encouraged the Director-General to consider, on a case-by-case basis and in full consultation with the affected countries, whether and at what point industrial rehabilitation and

reconstruction is a priority for a country emerging from a crisis situation. It requested the Director-General to take into account the need for an integrated approach that strikes the appropriate balance between humanitarian relief efforts and the restoration of productive capacities when planning post-crisis interventions. The resolution further requested the Director-General to ensure that UNIDO assistance to countries emerging from crisis situations is focused on activities that are clearly within UNIDO's mandate, as defined by the Business Plan and other key planning documents and is in line with nationally-owned poverty reduction strategies, where relevant. In addition, the resolution asked the Director-General to consider whether and in what way UNIDO activities in countries emerging from crisis in all regions should contribute to post-crisis industrial rehabilitation. The resolution furthermore encouraged the Director-General to take the necessary steps to ensure, in collaboration with other United Nations agencies, the continuation of UNIDO involvement in designing and, when the necessary conditions are secured, in implementing sustainable industrial development projects in countries emerging from crisis situations, in full consultation with the appropriate authorities.

3. Finally, the resolution requested the Director-General to submit a short progress report on the

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developments and steps taken in this regard to the twenty-eighth and twenty-ninth sessions of the Industrial Development Board.

I. DEVELOPMENTS AND STEPS TAKEN TO DATE

Approval of initiative activities

4. UNIDO's special initiative for post-crisis industrial rehabilitation and reconstruction focuses on facilitating the formulation of tailored responses to specific industrial development challenges faced by countries in post-crisis situations. This project proposal for the total amount of \$385,000 was approved on 6 March and 6 August 2003 respectively. Furthermore, a series of project proposals, mainly located in Africa and amounting to a total budget of \$1.5 million, were approved for post-crisis interventions.

Activities undertaken

In-house coordination

5. In order to facilitate in-house coordination for programming, implementation and monitoring of activities on this subject, an informal working group was established within the Programme Development and Technical Cooperation Division (PTC) and, specifically for Iraq, a task force was set up with the participation of staff from both the Programme Coordination and Field Operations Division (PCF) and PTC. The implementation of the activities on this subject was also assisted by a group of short-term experts and through redeployment of an internal staff member.

Research and strategy setting

6. A draft UNIDO strategy paper for post-crisis industrial rehabilitation and reconstruction was prepared which was the basis of the issue paper and the discussion paper presented at the General Conference round table in December 2003. The discussion paper is thus a clear reflection of the issues raised with regard to potential UNIDO interventions in countries emerging from crisis situations and presents the framework for UNIDO's programme on this issue. An official strategy paper is being finalized by incorporating the comments and recommendations made at the General Conference.

7. With a view to facilitating the understanding of the most pertinent issues of post-crisis assistance within the current global development agenda, a Post-crisis and Post-conflict Electronic Support Resource (PPESR) was established as part of UNIDO's Electronic Data Management System (EDMS). This system is a knowledge-based library with information/documentation on subject issues and

programme activities prepared and conducted by other agencies and organizations. The first phase of research and follow-up authorization to the contents of PPESR is 80 per cent complete. PPESR will be made operational on the Internet by the end of 2004 and will thus establish a forum for information exchange among various development partners.

Countries of intervention to date

8. UNIDO has conducted needs assessments and participated in inter-agency missions as well as organized programme formulation missions to the following 14 countries during the course of the year 2003: Afghanistan, Algeria, Angola, Congo, Côte d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Guatemala, Guinea, Iraq, Rwanda, Sierra Leone, Sri Lanka, Sudan and Timor-Leste. As a result, a number of preliminary and full-fledged programme documents as well as strategic frameworks were prepared. The concrete content and present status of activities in each country is referred to in the annex.

While not pursued specifically within the post-crisis initiative activities as described above, UNIDO interventions in countries emerging from crisis situations, such as Burundi (integrated programme), Iran (Bam earthquake) and Zimbabwe (natural disaster—drought) will be continued in order to formulate, implement and/or monitor the most viable programmes to respond to the industrial and economic recovery of the countries. A new challenge will emerge for UNIDO's interventions in countries in post-crisis situations, such as Liberia, for the biennium 2004-2005 in view of the international community's involvement in reconstruction efforts.

Round table on post-crisis industrial rehabilitation and reconstruction organized at the tenth session of the General Conference

10. At the tenth session of the General Conference, the post-crisis initiative received special attention at round table 4 which hosted distinguished panellists, such as the President of Timor-Leste, the Minister of Trade and Industry from Sierra Leone, the Permanent Representative of Japan to the United Nations in Vienna, a senior representative from the private sector of Sri Lanka, and senior staff from the United Nations system, all of whom shared their experience on post-crisis assistance. The panel discussions supported UNIDO's initiative and provided additional suggestions on ways and means for UNIDO interventions in the continuum from relief to rehabilitation and development in countries and areas affected by natural or man-made crises. Reference is made to the publication of summary presentations of the panellists and discussions of all round tables held during the tenth session of the General Conference (expected release in April 2004).

11. Resolution GC.10/Res.6 clearly noted the Secretariat's proposal in the issue paper for the round table that UNIDO's post-crisis initiative should be based on three basic principles: sound diagnosis, tailor-made responses, and close donor coordination and inter-agency collaboration.

Workshop on human security

12. Based on an initiative of the Permanent Mission of Japan, UNIDO co-organized a workshop on human security on 20 January 2004 with a view to discussing with Member States as well as Vienna-based United Nations agencies and other organizations the strategic framework of human security. UNIDO presented its initiative for post-crisis industrial rehabilitation and reconstruction as well as current and prospective interventions in this field. The Director-General announced that he intended to create a UNIDO Special Facility for Human Security with initial funds of up to

\$1 million, coming from UNIDO's own resources, for the purpose of financing: (a) preparatory assistance and programme development activities, (b) joint activities with other United Nations agencies, and (c) promotion of inter-agency and donor community consultations.

Update of activities

13. In view of the fact that various programming exercises are currently under way, further progress of the activities under this subject will be reported in due course. More detailed information will also be provided on UNIDO's business plan on post-crisis industrial rehabilitation and reconstruction for 2004-2005.

II. ACTION REQUIRED OF THE BOARD

14. The Board may wish to take note of the information in the present document.
