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FINANCIAL SITUATION OF UNIDO

Report by the Director-General

Provides information on the financial situation of UNIDO, including arrears, as at 29 February 2004. A conference room paper will be issued during the session to provide updated information on the status of assessed contributions, voting rights and disposition of unencumbered balances of appropriations and income from new Member States.

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I. OVERVIEW

1. The financial situation as at 29 February 2004 can be summarized in the following major points:

(a) The regular budget is planned to be implemented with an average allocation of 91 per cent of the 2004 appropriations. The expenditure for the first two months of 2004 amounted to 10.9 per cent;

(b) The operational budget recorded a surplus of €0.7 million during the first two months of 2004; therefore, the level of the operational budget reserve increased from €3.1 million as at 1 January 2004 to €3.8 million as at 29 February 2004;

(c) The level of regular budget cash resources (including the Working Capital Fund and the unencumbered balances of appropriations) was €35.3 million. As compared to this, the cash balance as at 28 February 2003 and 2002 was €47.5 million and €24.4 million, respectively;

(d) The collection rate of 2004 assessed contributions was 34.4 per cent, compared to the 2003 and 2002 rates of 58.1 and 28.2 per cent, respectively;

(e) The collection rate of prior years' arrears, as compared to the current year's assessments, was 1.3 per cent. The rates as at 28 February 2003 and 2002, as compared to the assessments of those years, were 0.6 and 1.8 per cent, respectively;

(f) Outstanding contributions amounted to €159.6 million (including arrears of €69.2 million by the United States of America, and €2.1 million by the former Yugoslavia) (annex). The outstanding amounts as at 28 February 2003 and 2002 were €139.1 million and €159.2 million, respectively;

(g) The Working Capital Fund is at the level of €7,423,030. However, an amount of €100,419 is outstanding as at 29 February 2004;

(h) Unencumbered balances of appropriations and income from new Member States (total amount €4,441,022) and the respective share was distributed to eligible Member States. However, some Member States voluntarily renounced their share for other purposes than assessed contributions amounting to €1.3 million by 29 February 2004.

II. REGULAR AND OPERATIONAL BUDGETS

2004-2005

2. Regular budget implementation of the approved programme and budgets, 2004-2005, commenced as

planned. In view of the reduced approval level of the gross regular budget, as well as the expected collection rate of current year's assessed contributions of some 93 per cent and the healthy cash position of the Organization at the beginning of 2004, an average allotment level of some 91 per cent of the originally planned gross expenditures is envisaged for 2004, including UNIDO's share of Buildings Management. Except for the Regular Programme of Technical Cooperation (RPTC), reduced allotment levels will be necessary under each object of expenditure.

3. The Buildings Management gross allotments will be released at the level required for the work programme and will largely depend on the progress of the asbestos removal programme.

4. Expenditure during the period 1 January to 29 February 2004 amounted to €7.98 million under the regular budget. This amount corresponds to 10.9 per cent of the total appropriation for 2004, representing a smooth start of budget implementation.

5. Allotments under the operational budget will be around 95 per cent of the approved estimates. With a \$25.8 million delivery of technical cooperation activities as of 29 February 2004 (delivery as at end February 2003 for the same period was \$26.9 million), the income for the first two months amounted to €2.1 million (\$2.4 million). Expenditure for the same period amounted to €1.4 million, leading to a surplus of €0.7 million during these months of 2004. Therefore, the level of the operational budget reserve increased from €3.1 million as at 1 January 2004 to €3.8 million as at 29 February 2004.

2002-2003

6. The accounts for the biennium 2002-2003 have been submitted for audit to the External Auditor. As in the past, the report of the External Auditor for the biennium 2002-2003 will be submitted through the Programme and Budget Committee at its twentieth session to the twenty-ninth session of the Board.

7. The overall implementation rate of the regular budget for the biennium 2002-2003 was 92.36 per cent, resulting in a provisional unencumbered balance of appropriations of €10,205,968. Part of this amount has been realized through exchange rate gains and hence is being captured on the respective reserve account. This implementation rate is similar to the previous two bienniums (2000-2001: 96.4 per cent; 1998-1999: 91.7 per cent).

8. The programme support cost income of the operational budget for the biennium 2002-2003 amounted to €18.0 million, with expenditures of €18.8 million. Calculated together with the amount of

€0.6 million savings on cancellation of obligations, the operational budget recorded a deficit of €0.2 million. The reserve level thus decreased from €3.3 million on 1 January 2002 to €3.1 million as at 31 December 2003. The slight decrease in the reserve level was attributable to exchange rate movements between the euro and the United States dollar during the biennium.

9. Technical cooperation delivery during 2003 amounted to \$94.7 million. However, should the technical services at the programme and project levels of UNDP and Industrial Development Decade for Africa supplementary activities be added to this amount, the volume of activities provided by UNIDO during the year amounted to over \$100 million.

10. Resources provided from the regular budget for the purpose of the RPTC were fully programmed before 31 December 2003. Funds amounting to €2.5 million which had not been expended by the end of the 2002-2003 biennium have been placed in the special account for RPTC in accordance with General Conference decision GC.9/Dec.14. In 2004, €0.8 million have been further committed. Funds released from cancellation of obligations, if any, will remain in the special account to carry out RPTC activities. It is anticipated that all programmed activities from the 2002-2003 resources will be completed during 2004.

III. ASSESSED CONTRIBUTIONS

Collections

11. A total of 27 Member States, including six least developed countries (LDCs), have made full payments

and 47 Member States, including nine LDCs, have made partial payments and/or their adjustments have been credited towards their assessed contributions for the year 2004. The collections in the period January-February 2004, broken down by Lists of States, are shown in table 1.

IV. VOTING RIGHTS

13. As indicated in the annex to the present document, the voting rights of 49 Member States had been suspended as at 29 February 2004 in accordance with Article 5.2 of the Constitution and financial regulation 5.5(b), as shown in table 3.

14. In order to restore their voting rights for the remainder of 2004, the 49 Member States must pay their full contributions for 2001 and prior years, including advances to the Working Capital Fund, as well as a partial contribution for 2002. The minimum total amount that would have to be paid by these Member States is €24,948,170.

V. IMPLEMENTATION OF RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE GROUP ON TIMELY PAYMENTS

Payment plans

15. Four payment plans are currently in operation: Azerbaijan, Belarus, Lithuania and Ukraine. The General Conference, at its tenth session, gave satisfaction to the requests of the first three countries mentioned for the restoration of voting rights in accordance with Article 5.2 of the UNIDO Constitution (decisions GC.10/Dec.12, 13 and 14) and took note of the payment plan agreements. Similarly, at the ninth session of the General Conference, voting rights were restored for Ukraine (GC.9/Dec.12). Payment plans are currently under negotiation at various levels with a number of Member States, in particular Afghanistan, Brazil and Tajikistan.

Incentives and disincentives to encourage timely payment of assessed contributions

16. With reference to previous information provided on this issue in documents PBC.19/CRP.5, IDB.27/10

and GC.10/12, the Secretariat received information from the Committee on Contributions that the General Assembly had requested the Committee to make recommendations on measures with a positive impact to encourage Member States to pay their arrears. The Committee is currently updating information on the related experience of other organizations of the United Nations system and will report thereon to the Assembly before the end of its fifty-eighth session (i.e. September 2004). The Secretariat will closely follow developments on this issue and will inform the governing bodies accordingly.

Arrears by former Member States

17. The amounts owed to UNIDO by the United States are as follows:

The Secretariat is regularly following up this matter with the Permanent Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations in Vienna to pursue payment.

18. The arrears of the former Yugoslavia amount to €2,081,702 for the period 1990 to 2001. The United Nations General Assembly decided to defer until its fifty-ninth session consideration of the question of the outstanding assessed contributions of the former Yugoslavia. The Secretariat will keep the governing bodies informed of further developments.

VI. UNENCUMBERED BALANCES OF APPROPRIATIONS AND INCOME FROM NEW MEMBER STATES

19. Detailed information on the unencumbered balances of appropriations and income from new Member States was provided in document GC.10/12 of 31 October 2003. In accordance with General Conference decision GC.10/Dec.11, the Secretariat is allowed to use for integrated programmes or country service frameworks each country's share and amount of the unencumbered balances of appropriations, income from new Member States and interest income in excess of budgetary estimates, as specified in decision GC.9/Dec.10, for which no response had been received by 31 December 2003 from the concerned Member States on the use of those funds.

20. The unencumbered balances of appropriations relating to the bienniums 1992-1993, 1996-1997, 1998-1999 and 2000-2001, and income from new Member States amounted to €4,441,022, and the respective share was distributed to eligible Member States (i.e. those that had fully paid their assessed contributions for the respective biennium) in accordance with financial regulations 4.2(b) and (c), broken down as follows:
