## Financial situation of UNIDO

### Report by the Director-General

Provides information on the financial situation of the Organization as at 31 March 2009.

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## I. Overview

1. The financial situation as at 31 March 2009 can be summarized in the following major points:

(a) Regular budget net expenditure for the first year of the biennium 2008-2009 amounted to €65.0 million in 2008, or 85.5 per cent of the approved 2008 net budget estimates. As at 31 March 2009, €86.6 million or 54.2 per cent of the gross biennial appropriation was spent;

(b) The operational budget expenditure amounted to €9.4 million in 2008. Support cost and other income during 2008 amounted to €9 million, resulting in a marginal decrease in the level of the operating reserve from €6.5 million as at 1 January 2008 to €6.4 million as at 31 December 2008. In the first quarter of 2009, additional support cost income of €3.2 million and expenditure of €2.2 million were recorded. In the first quarter of 2009, technical cooperation delivery reached US\$49.3 million, exceeding that of last year by US\$16.3 million;

(c) The expenditure level for buildings management in 2008 amounted to €20.2 million in accordance with the prevailing work plan;

(d) The level of regular budget cash resources (including the Working Capital Fund) was €75.0 million. In comparison, the cash balance as at 31 March 2008 and 2007 was €58.5 million and €59.1 million, respectively;

(e) The collection rate of 2009 assessed contributions was 47.3 per cent, compared to the 2008 and 2007 rates of 38.1 and 40.8 per cent, respectively;

(f) The collection rate of prior years' arrears, as compared to the current year's assessments, was 0.3 per cent. The rates as at 31 March 2008 and 2007, as compared to the assessments of those years, were 0.7 and 1.3 per cent, respectively;

(g) Outstanding assessed contributions amounted to €155.5 million, as shown in the annex to the present document (including arrears of €69.1 million by the United States of America, and €2.1 million by the former Yugoslavia). The outstanding amounts as at 31 March 2008 and 2007 were €167.1 million and €162.6 million, respectively;

(h) The Working Capital Fund was at the level of €7,423,030. However, an amount of €16,448 was outstanding as at 31 March 2009;

(i) As at 31 March 2009, unencumbered balances of appropriations provisionally amount to €14.4 million and will be due for distribution in 2010 (document IDB.36/12-PBC.25/12 refers). In addition, interest income in excess of budgetary estimates amounting to €2.4 million will also be due for distribution;

(j) A conference room paper on the status of assessed contributions and voting rights, updated to 31 May 2009, will be provided to the thirty-sixth session of the Industrial Development Board.

## II. Regular and operational budgets, 2008-2009

### Regular budget

2. The implementation of the biennial regular budget progressed as planned in 2008. Cognizant of an expected collection rate of assessed contribution of 93 per cent, an initial allotment of €68.8 million was issued at the onset of the biennium. This comprised €41.2 million for staff on established posts and €27.6 million for all other expenditure categories. While non-staff costs were mostly issued at full rate, travel, consultancy and expert group meeting funds were released at a lower rate pending finalization of the work programmes. Allotments for the Regular Programme of Technical Cooperation and Special Resources for Africa were issued in full.

3. By 31 December 2008, regular budget net expenditures amounted to €65.0 million. This amount corresponds to 85.5 per cent of the total approved net regular budget for 2008. In the first year of the preceding biennium (2006), a lower implementation rate of 81.8 per cent was recorded.

4. As at 31 March 2009, total regular budget allotments for the biennium amounted to €153.1 million, which represents 96 per cent of the gross expenditure budget. Expenditures amounted to €86.6 million, corresponding to 54.2 per cent of the gross budget. These indicators are comparable with those of the previous biennium, by 31 March 2007: €82.9 million expenditures representing 53.8 per cent of the gross budget.

### Operational budget

5. In the operational budget, total income (most of it being reimbursement for programme support costs) amounted to €9 million during 2008. Expenditures were recorded in the amount of €9.4 million, resulting in an excess of expenditure over income in the amount of €0.4 million. Savings on cancellation of prior biennium obligations reduced the excess of expenditure over income by €0.3 million and thus the net deficit for the period amounted to €0.1 million. The resulting closing balance of the special account for programme support costs was €6.4 million as compared to the opening balance of €6.5 million.

6. The delivery of technical cooperation activities in 2008 amounted to US\$123.6 million, representing an increase of US\$9.9 million from the first year of the previous biennium. Compared with the 2007 amount of US\$117.3 million the delivery of 2008 shows an increase of US\$6.3 million mainly attributable to the increase in trust funds, EU fund and Multi-Donor Trust Fund activities, including One UN Funds.

### Buildings management

7. The buildings management budget is being implemented in accordance with the prevailing work plan. Expenditures in 2008 amounted to €20.2 million, which compares to €17.4 million in 2006. As at 31 March 2009, €31.7 million was spent.

### III. Assessed contributions

#### A. Collections

8. A total of 44 Member States, including six least developed countries (LDCs), have made full payments and 52 Member States, seven of which are LDCs, have made partial payments and/or their adjustments have been credited towards their assessed contributions for the year 2009. The collections in the period from January to March 2009, broken down by List of States, are shown in table 1.

## IV. Voting rights

10. As indicated in the annex to the present document, the voting rights of 44 Member States had been suspended as at 31 March 2009, in accordance with Article 5.2 of the Constitution and financial regulation 5.5 (b), as shown in table 3.

11. In order to restore their voting rights for 2009, these Member States must pay their full contributions for 2006 and prior years, including advances to the Working Capital Fund, as well as a partial contribution for 2007. The minimum total amount that would have to be paid by these Member States is €29,901,630.

## V. Multi-year payment plans

12. Table 4 shows, in summary form, the current status of those Member States that have entered into payment plan arrangements to settle outstanding assessed contributions. The Secretariat notes with appreciation and recognizes the considerable efforts made by all those Member States that have honoured their commitments and obligations as stipulated in their respective payment plans.

13. Other Member States in arrears are encouraged to consider submitting payment plans to steadily reduce their outstanding assessed contributions.

### Arrears by former Member States

14. The amounts owed to UNIDO by the United States of America are as follows:

Payment of these arrears is being pursued by the Secretariat.

15. Arrears of the former Yugoslavia amount to €2,081,599 (1990-2001). Resolution 63/249 was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on 24 December 2008, regarding the unpaid assessed contributions of the former Yugoslavia. The following is stated therein inter alia:

“*The General Assembly,*

“ ...

“1. *Decides* that the unpaid assessed contributions to the account of the former Yugoslavia up to 27 April 1992, ... shall be apportioned among the successor States of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, taking into account the respective dates on which each successor State informed the Secretary-General that it had ceased to exist as part of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, and the proportions set forth in article 5(2) of annex C to the Agreement on Succession Issues of 29 June 2001,<sup>1</sup> ...;

“2. ...;

“3. *Urges*, in this regard, the successor States of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia to inform the Secretary-General as soon as possible of their respective shares of the outstanding amounts and credits, in accordance with paragraph 1 above;

“4. *Decides* that the issue of the unpaid assessed contributions to the account of the former Yugoslavia shall be considered to be finally resolved upon receipt by the Secretary-General of the information requested in paragraph 3 above, and that the resolution of the issue of the unpaid assessed contributions of the former Yugoslavia to the United Nations shall be applicable only to that issue, without prejudice to any other related decisions and issues.”

16. The Secretariat will continue to follow up on this issue and as soon as the requested information is obtained regarding the respective shares due from the successor States of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia in line with the above resolution, the governing bodies will be informed accordingly and appropriate action will be taken by the Secretariat to resolve these outstanding arrears.

## **VI. Unencumbered balances of appropriations and interest income in excess of budgetary estimates**

17. The amount of €1,503,098 from the bienniums 1992-1993 and 1996-2005 was collected and distributed to eligible Member States in 2009.

18. As at 31 March 2009, the provisional amount due for distribution in 2010 is €14.4 million. Detailed information on the unencumbered balances of appropriations is provided in document IDB.36/12-PBC.25/12.

19. The amount of €2.4 million for the biennium 2006-2007 from interest income in excess of budgetary estimates is due for distribution in 2010 to eligible Member States.

## **VII. Action required of the Committee**

20. The Committee may wish to consider recommending to the Board the adoption of the following draft decision:

“The Industrial Development Board:

“(a) Takes note of the information provided in document IDB.36/5-PBC.25/5;

“(b) Urges those Member States and former Member States that have not yet paid their assessed contributions, including advances to the Working Capital Fund and prior years’ arrears, to do so without delay;

“(c) Requests the Director-General to pursue his efforts and contacts with Member States and former Member States to effect the collection of arrears.”
