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REPORT OF THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD
ON THE WORK OF ITS THIRD SPECIAL SESSION

24 November 1989

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Introduction

1. The report of the Industrial Development Board on the work of its third special session is presented to the General Conference in accordance with Article 9.4 (c) of the Constitution.

The present report should be read in conjunction with the summary record of the Board (IDB/S.3/SR.1), where details of the proceedings are contained.

I. ORGANIZATIONAL AND PROCEDURAL MATTERS

2. The third special session of the Board was held at the Austria Center Vienna on 24 November 1989. (One plenary meeting - see IDB/S.3/SR.1)

Participation

3.
