- II. FUTURE POLICY FRAMEWORK AND ORGANIZATIONAL AND STAFF STRUCTURE OF UNIDO
- 15. The Board had before it proposals by the Director-General on priorities and structural

reform of UNIDO (IDB.11/31) and conference room papers on: a synopsis of the emerging pattern of demand for UNIDO services (IDB.11/CRP.7), the new organizational structure of UNIDO showing the composition and coordination of major organizational units (IDB.11/CRP.8) and joint United Nations/UNIDO conference services (IDB.11/CRP.10). The debate on the subject is reflected in summary records IDB.11/SR.9 and 10. The Board considered a draft decision submitted by the President (IDB.11/L.34/Rev.1) and adopted decision IDB.11/Dec.40 (see annex I). For statements made in connection with the adoption of the decision, see summary record IDB.11/SR.11, paragraphs 2 and 4.

III. PREPARATORY ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE FIFTH SESSION OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE

16. The debate on the subject is reflected in summary record IDB.11/SR.11, paragraphs 5 and 7 to 11. The Board considered a draft decision submitted by the President (IDB.11/L.33) and adopted decision IDB.11/Dec.41 (see annex I).

IV. PROVISIONAL AGENDA FOR THE TWELFTH REGULAR SESSION

17. The Board had before it a conference room paper on the provisional agenda for the twelfth regular session of the Board (IDB.11/CRP.9). The Board considered a draft decision submitted by the President (IDB.11/L.35) and adopted decision IDB.11/Dec.42 (see annex I).

V. ADOPTION OF THE REPORT AND SUSPENSION OF THE ELEVENTH SESSION

18. The Board entrusted the Rapporteur with the task of finalizing the report (see summary record IDB.11/SR.11, paras. 14-15). On 29 October, at 3.50 p.m., the Board suspended its eleventh session (see annex I, decision IDB.11/Dec.40, para. (e)).

The Industrial Development Board:

A.

- (a) Endorsed and recommended to the General Conference at its fifth session for its consideration and approval the proposals of the Director-General set out in document IDB.11/31-GC.5/23 on the future policy framework of UNIDO and its organizational and staff structure;
- (b) Decided, in the light of the proposed structural reform of UNIDO to revoke Board decision IDB.1/Dec.11, which no longer met the requirements of the Organization and to report thereon to the General Conference at its fifth session;
- (c) Recalled its decision IDB.11/Dec.24 and requested the Director-General to make the necessary adjustments to the proposed regular budget appropriations, on the basis of document IDB.11/31-GC.5/23 and paragraph (b) above, not exceeding the level of the financial ceiling recommended in decision IDB.11/Dec.24;
- (d) Further requested the Director-General, keeping in mind financial regulation 4.3 (a), to redistribute the budgetary resources resulting from the implementation of the present decision in accordance with the new priorities and programmes proposed for the Organization and bearing in mind the development objectives of UNIDO;
- (e) Decided to convene an additional session of the Programme and Budget Committee on Monday morning, 22 November 1993 and to resume again, immediately thereafter, its eleventh session for the purpose of considering the adjustments to the proposals of the Director-General for the programme of work and related estimates for the 1994-1995 biennium.
