









FORUM PART II: Global Economic Recovery: Seizing Opportunities for Greening Industries

<p>Mr. Gunter Pauli (Keynote speaker)</p> 	<p>Director, Zero Emissions Research and Initiatives (ZERI)</p> <p>Prof. Dr. Pauli founded and directs the "Zero Emissions Research Initiative" of the United Nations University in Tokyo, redesigning manufacturing processes into non-polluting clusters of industries. He laid the basis for the design of the first zero emissions industrial park in Chattanooga, Tennessee, USA.</p>

<p>Mr. Ola Alterå</p> 	<p>State Secretary to the Minister for Enterprise and Energy, Sweden</p> <p>Since 2006 Mr. Ola Alterå has held the position of State Secretary, Ministry of Enterprise, Energy and Communications in Sweden where he is responsible for directing day-to-day business of the Ministry with respect to enterprise, energy and communications policy. Previously he was Managing Director of the Swedish District Heating Association – the industrial organisation for district heating companies – and held positions as Secretary-General of the Centre Party as well as Director of the Department for Environmental Economics at the Swedish Environmental Protection Agency.</p>
<p>Mr. Gerard Evenden</p> 	<p>Senior Partner and Design Director, Foster + Partners</p> <p>Mr. Evenden joined the practice in 1991 following his graduation from the Welsh School of Architecture at UWIST. Current projects include The Troika in Kuala Lumpur, three luxury residential towers in Malaysia and the Index Building, a mixed-use 80-storey tower in Dubai.</p>

Prior to that, he was one Commissioner of the Regulatory Authority for Electricity and Natural Gas of Italy. He has also served as the Director of the Energy Department at the ENEA.</p>

He currently sits on the Advisor Board for the German Foundation for World Population. In 2005 he was appointed dean of the Donald Bren School of Environmental Science and Management at the University of California, Santa Barbara.</p>
