

### **PCP ETHIOPIA - IMPLEMENTATION PHASE**

The PCP supports the Growth and Transformation Plan II and the structural transformation of the economy through industrialization to realize Ethiopia's vision of becoming a middle-income country by 2025.

Priority areas: Agro-food processing, textiles and apparel, and leather and leather products.



# **PCP SENEGAL - IMPLEMENTATION PHASE**

The PCP supports the implementation of the Plan Sénégal Emergent, which aims to transform Senegal into an emerging country by 2035.

Priority areas: Industrial policy, agro-poles, integrated industrial parks, regional mining hub, and special economic zones and incentive package reform.



### **PCP PERU - IMPLEMENTATION PHASE**

The PCP aims to drive modern, competitive and inclusive industrialization in line with the Plan Bicentenario: El Perú hacia el 2021 and the government's goal of acquiring membership in the OECD.

Priority areas: Quality and innovation, value chain and enterprise development, sustainable industrial parks and zones, industrial resource and energy efficiency, and renewable energy.



### **PCP MOROCCO - IMPLEMENTATION PHASE**

The PCP supports the implementation of the national Industrial Acceleration Plan 2014-2020, which aims to make industry a major driver of economic growth. Priority areas: Industrial zones, agro-industry, energy, circular economy, industry 4.0. and E-commerce.



## **PCP KYRGYZSTAN - PROGRAMMING PHASE**

The PCP is supporting the government in implementing a national industrial development strategy and an action plan to drive inclusive and sustainable

Priority areas: Agro-processing value chains (focus on food and beverages), textiles and apparel, strengthening linkages between tourism and productive industries, modernizing the construction materials industry, sustainable development of the mining sector, and development of technical infrastructure for industrialization.



### PCP CAMBODIA - PROGRAMMING PHASE

The PCP will support the implementation of the country's Industry Development Policy as well as the government's goal of graduating to upper middle-income status by 2030.

Priority areas: Sustainable tourism, agro-industry and creative industry value chains, and industrial diversification through special economic zones.







# PROGRAMME FOR COUNTRY PARTNERSHIP (PCP)

The PCP is UNIDO's newest programmatic service to support countries in accelerating inclusive and sustainable industrial development. Each programme is tailored to country needs and owned by the host government.

The PCP focuses on priority industrial sectors or areas essential to the national development agenda. PCP interventions also aim to unlock public and private investment for the realization of large-scale industrial projects.

The PCP is founded on a multi-stakeholder partnership to ensure synergies among different projects and programmes, and maximize development impact. By facilitating the mobilization of expertise, technology and financial resources from various partners, the PCP supports countries in advancing Sustainable Development Goal 9 on industry, innovation and infrastructure, which echoes UNIDO's mandate, while also contributing to other goals of the 2030 Agenda.

# **Integrated service package**

The PCP combines UNIDO's advisory and normative services, technical assistance and convening function to deliver an integrated service package to Member States.

While PCP ownership rests firmly with the government, UNIDO's role is to:

- Conduct a country diagnostic to identify the main opportunities and bottlenecks for advancing industrialization
- Identify and convene partners to build synergies
- Design and develop a holistic programme to accelerate the country's industrial development
- Provide advisory services and deliver technical assistance
- Facilitate the overall coordination of the programme

Depending on country-specific requirements, UNIDO supports, among others:

- Policy and strategy development
- Feasibility studies for major industrial projects
- Development of industrial zones and eco-industrial parks
- Investment promotion activities
- Resource and energy efficiency
- Skills training programmes
- Gender mainstreaming

# **PCP COUNTRIES**

The PCP was first introduced in 2014 and is currently ongoing in Ethiopia, Senegal, Peru, Morocco, Kyrgyzstan, and Cambodia. In 2019, UNIDO initiated the formulation of new PCPs for Côte d'Ivoire, Egypt, Rwanda, and Zambia. The programme will gradually expand to additional countries.
