#### Green energy Initiatives

Unga has worked closely with solar energy providers and is currently installing renewable energy capacity at all of its facilities.

In 2020/21 the Eldoret Plant's PaTaMu initiative lowered energy usage from an average of 77kWh/MT in 2019/2020 to the current 68kWh/MT. The project took a holistic approach, focusing on reducing operational downtime by eliminating redundant high-power-consuming equipment or replacing it with more efficient motors, using natural lighting, installing solar lights and replacing old power correction factor bank capacitors.


